### **Title**

- Role of interleukin 198 for ACLF in NASH-cirrhosis
- Important interaction of interleukin 198 in cellular compartments of hepatocytes, but not hepatic stellate cells, in diet-induced NASH cirrhosis developing ACLF
- 3. Interleukin 198 induces ACLF in NASH-cirrhosis via ERstress in hepatocytes
- Catchy
- Concise
- Bring the main message
- Match with the Journal





### **Abstract**

- Background ending with aims
  - Very shortly: what's know, what's not!!
- Material and methods
  - key experiments, what makes your study special., points
- Results
  - NOT each western blot, lab value, comparison, each control group
- Conclusions
  - Main few messages!

# STYLE – too long sentences







# but guide your readers through the manuscript.







# PREPARE FOR THE RESULTS!!

- What's known, what's not!!
- Why did you do it?
- Why it is needed for the field?
- Why it is important for the journal?
- Max. 1-1,5 pages





### **Material and methods**

### **NEVER FORGET:**

- Ethics
- Description of the cohorts
- Previously published papers on the same cohort
- Controls/validation for your key experiments, calculations,
- Definitions of key endpoints, outcomes
- Try to show the same finding/conclusion with different techniques

### **Discussion**

### **Don't forget:**

- The reviewers are not your friends
- The reviewers may be your competitors
- Never copy-paste
- The readers don't forgive mistakes

## Always ...

- Try to summarize the key findings
- Discuss each of the crucial findings in the view of different opinions
- Highlight the limitations of your study
- Don't speculate to much
- If you do speculate, then clearly state it and be aware the reviewer may/will ask for it
- Don't write about things you cannot proof

# **Don't forget:**

- The published literature
- Always reference only papers you have read yourself
- The groups working on the field
- The different opinions on the topic
- Each statement needs a reference
- You can loos your title if you don't reference carefully
